1. The Royal South Street Society

The Royal South Street Society is dedicated to promoting and encouraging participation, enjoyment and enrichment through the performing arts. First founded in 1879 as the Ballarat South Street Society, it was created to promote and encourage music and elocution in the local community from a modest local hall.

Granted 'Royal' status in 1888, by Queen Victoria, the Royal South Street Society Ballarat Eisteddfod has grown to become Australia's longest running premier eisteddfod, hosting an array of performing arts disciplines including music, dance, speech, drama, vocal, instrumental and all abilities performance.

The annual Eisteddfod runs between July and October at a range of quality venues throughout the Ballarat region, attracting thousands of participants of all ages from all over Australia, and sometimes international, showcasing and encouraging the artistic talents of thousands of performers each year. Participants receive constructive feedback from industry professionals and are also provided with opportunities to compete for prestigious awards and scholarships. Countless performers (alumni) have gone on to become amateur and notable professional performing artists, teachers, adjudicators and industry professionals, or continue to use disciplines and skills learned from early years of performance in their alternative professional careers.

The Royal South Street Society has become integral to the artistic cultural fabric of regional Victoria and a well-respected institution in the Australian performing arts scene. With an emphasis on inclusivity guiding the Eisteddfod's growth and progression, the introduction of disciplines for all abilities, non-competitive critique only, and cultural diversity have been welcome additions. The diverse programming and accessible venues attract a wider range of spectators and enthusiasts which enriches the overall experience for everyone, fostering a sense of community and celebration of the performing arts.

The Royal South Street Society's enduring commitment to nurturing talent, providing a platform for performance opportunities, and celebrating the arts has contributed to the ongoing legacy of the Eisteddfod and we look forward to welcoming you to our stage in.... 2025.

4. Energetiks Dance Competition Dates & Registrations

Dates:

- Troupe Weekend Saturday 20 September & Sunday 21 September
- **Solo Competition** Tuesday 16 September Saturday 04 October (please note that pre-troupe solos will be dependent on entry numbers and only be the junior competitors)

Important note: These dates are subject to change based on final entries.

Entries:

Registrations (entries) will be available via MyStage (link on website) and will open on:

- Entries open 01 March 2025
- Entries close 29 June 2025

Important Notes:

- Please contact Royal South Street Society as soon as possible if you are having difficulties with your entries and we will endeavour to assist you.
- Please ensure that you and your students/ guardians check the <u>Rules and</u>
 <u>Conditions of Entry</u> to ensure they are entering in the correct section and have noted the guidelines.

5. Section Offering

Troupes - Entry fee \$70

Please note: Should there be insufficient entries, sections and/or age groups may be combined.

Average age will be used for all troupe and crew entries. This is calculated by adding all of the ages (as at 31 December in the preceding year) and dividing this by the number of performers in the troupe. The final age group will not be more than one age group below that of the oldest dancer in the troupe. For example: if 6 dancers are 11, one is 14, and one is 17 the average age is 12.12, However they must compete in 15/U and not 13/U due to the 17 year old dancer.

Additional Sections

NOTE: These sections are not calculated towards aggregate points.

Male Identifying Solo

Male identifying only section (open age & open genre), this will be performed in age order and <u>may</u> be a repeat of a solo performance, but not a repeat of a championship performance. This will not accrue aggregate points.

Classical Ballet Variations

This section is open to performers aged 10 years and over at the time of entry and will be performed in age order. Can be performed en pointe or demi pointe as per the discretion of the students' teacher.

VET/VCE Dance

This section is open to all students studying VCE VET or VCE Dance. Student's do not have to be associated with a dance school to compete in this section. Students will be scored according to the VCE rubric.

8. Technical Specifications

The incredible artistry of dance is not just about the dancers; we see their grace and technique when they perform on the stage, but our performing arts schools can also present a 'show' on the Royal South Street Society Ballarat Eisteddfod stage. A stage 'show' traditionally includes stage props, flys and lights.

In 2025 we will continue to offer the opportunity to stage your troupe performance with fly's, fog and incredible lighting as we partner with Her Majesty's Theatre once again.

Plotting Sessions

In 2025, after much consultation, we will continue to offer our troupes the opportunity to plot these performances prior to the commencement of the troupe weekend.

Plotting sessions are available with each troupe performance being able to plot for 15mins. Costs TBA.

Music

Music is required for submission NO LATER than **Tuesday 12 August 2025** (troupes and solos) in Mp3 or Mp4 format only. Submission specifications will be advised (either via drop box link or CRM)

Lighting & Specs

We love this glitz and glamour of a performance and as such, have provided the opportunity for schools to hang fly's for your troupe performances. Time will be available to do

9. Photography & Videography

In 2025 we will continue to work with photographers/videographers - TBC and we will work closely with them to ensure all of the requests from 2024 are considered.

These include:

- Ensuring all schools have a separate folder (password protected) for both troupes and solos so that video previews cannot be accessed by anyone outside of the school.
- Maintaining cost effective packages for competitors and schools.

Please Note: No photography or videography on any device (including mobile phones) permitted in any dressing rooms by any participant, teacher, parent, supporter or member of the RSSS or theatres.

10. Troupe Numbers:

We understand that change rooms are always a challenge to navigate, and we work hard to ensure there are suitable spaces for everyone and that these spaces are manageable. Therefore, we ask that all troupes entries ensure they **provide Royal South Street with their troupe numbers at the time of music submission.** Understandably, these numbers may change slightly, and we ask only that you update us should there be a significant change in numbers.
