1. The Royal South Street Society

The Royal South Street Society is dedicated to promoting and encouraging participation, enjoyment and enrichment through the performing arts. First founded in 1879 as the Ballarat South Street Society, it was created to promote and encourage music and elocution in the local community from a modest local hall.

Granted 'Royal' status in 1888, by Queen Victoria, the Royal South Street Society Ballarat Eisteddfod has grown to become Australia's longest running premier eisteddfod, hosting an array of performing arts disciplines including music, dance, speech, drama, vocal, instrumental and all abilities performance.

The annual Eisteddfod runs between June and October at a range of quality venues throughout the Ballarat region, attracting thousands of participants of all ages from all over Australia, and sometimes international, showcasing and encouraging the artistic talents of thousands of performers each year. Participants receive constructive feedback from industry professionals and are also provided with opportunities to compete for prestigious awards and scholarships. Countless performers (alumni) have gone on to become amateur and notable professional performing artists, teachers, adjudicators and industry professionals, or continue to use disciplines and skills learned from early years of performance in their alternative professional careers.

The Royal South Street Society has become integral to the artistic cultural fabric of regional Victoria and a well-respected institution in the Australian performing arts scene. With an emphasis on inclusivity guiding the Eisteddfod's growth and progression, the introduction of disciplines for all abilities, non-competitive critique only, and cultural diversity have been welcome additions. The diverse programming and accessible venues attract a wider range of spectators and enthusiasts which enriches the overall experience for everyone, fostering a sense of community and celebration of the performing arts.

The Royal South Street Society's enduring commitment to nurturing talent, providing a platform for performance opportunities, and celebrating the arts has contributed to the ongoing legacy of the Eisteddfod and we look forward to welcoming you to our stage in.... 2026.

4. Energetiks Dance Competition Dates & Registrations

2026 Dates:

- Troupe Weekend Saturday 19 September to Monday 21 September
- **Solo Competition** Tuesday 15 September Saturday 03 October (please note that pre-troupe weekend solos will be dependent on entry numbers and will only be the junior competitors)

Important to note: All dates are subject to final entries. If there are any concerns, please be certain to advise before entries close - as the performance schedule will be developed immediately upon entries closing.

Entries:

Registrations (entries) will be available via a link on website and will open on:

- Entries open 01 March 2026
- Entries close 27 June 2026
- NO late entries will be accepted.

Important Notes:

- Please contact Royal South Street Society as soon as possible if you are having difficulties with your entries and we will endeavour to assist you.
- Please ensure that you and your students/ guardians check the <u>Rules and Conditions of Entry</u> to ensure they are entering in the correct section and have noted the guidelines.

5. Section Offering

Troupes

Please note: Should there be insufficient entries, sections and/or age groups may be combined.

Average age will be used for all troupe and crew entries. This is calculated by adding all of the ages (as at 31st of December in the preceding year) and dividing this by the number of performers in the troupe.

Please also note that a performer within a troupe must not be any more than 2 years older than the age group as at December 31st of the preceding year.

i.e. A person who is 12 years of age on December 31st in the year prior to the eisteddfod may perform in the 10 years and under troupe. If they are 13 years of age at this time, despite fitting into the age group as an average, may not compete in the troupe.

Additional Sections

NOTE: These sections are not calculated towards aggregate points.

Male Identifying Solo

Competitors in this section will perform a single solo of any genre and this may be a repeat of any section (excluding championships and other special section solos). Competitors will perform in age order so as to allow adjudicators to depict the complexities of the performance based on expected capacity for their age. As this can be a repeat of a solo, aggregate points will not accrue from this performance. This section may be split by genre and/or age dependent on entries.

Classical Ballet Variations

Competitors in this section will dance a classical variation of their choosing appropriate to their age and skill set. Competitors will perform in age order so as to allow adjudicators to depict the complexities of the performance based on expected capacity for their age. This section is open to ages from 10 years old at time of entry. This section will accrue aggregate points. There are no prerequisites to qualify for this section.

Section will be split based on age dependent on entry numbers.

• VET/VCE Dance

Competitors will perform a solo piece as per the requirements of the study path chosen. Competitors must be currently enrolled to study VCE dance or VET dance and are to be unaided by their teacher. Competitors do not need to be associated with a dance school in order to compete in this section but may be asked for evidence that they are enrolled in the subject in the current year. Adjudicators will use the current year rubric to support adjudication. As this section has a pre-requisite associated outside of the eisteddfod, this section will not accrue aggregate points.

• Open Solo (any genre)

Competitors in this section will perform a single solo of any genre existing or not existing within the current competition but must include dance of some form - i.e. this may be a classical ballet, neo-classical, contemporary, lyrical, jazz of any style, tap, song and tap, song and dance, hip hop, acro, own choreography, Latin, musical theatre, demi-character, Irish, cultural. It must not be repertoire or plagiarised choreography. Props may be used.

8. Technical Specifications

The artistry of dance isn't only in the performers on stage – our participating performing arts schools can also create full theatrical experiences on the RSSS stage. A traditional stage 'show' features props, flys and lighting, and in 2026 we're again partnering with Her Majesty's Theatre to offer your troupe the chance to perform with professional flys, fog effects and lighting.

Plotting Sessions

In 2026, after much consultation, we will again offer our troupes the opportunity to plot these performances prior to the commencement of the troupe weekend.

Plotting sessions are available with each troupe performance being able to plot for 15mins. Costs TBA.

Music

Music is required for submission NO LATER than **September 01** (troupes and solos) in Mp3 or Mp4 format only.

Lighting & Specs

9. Photography & Videography

In 2026 we will be working with a new and well known dance photographer to ensure your purchase of photographs and videos are well supported and of the highest quality.

Please Note: No photography or videography on any device (including mobile phones) permitted in any dressing rooms by any participant, teacher, parent, supporter or member of the RSSS or theatres.

10. Troupe Numbers:

We understand that change rooms are always a challenge to navigate, and we work hard to ensure there are suitable spaces for everyone and that these spaces are manageable. Therefore, we ask that all troupes entries ensure they **provide Royal South Street**Society with their troupe numbers at the time of music submission. Understandably, these numbers may change slightly, and we ask only that you update us should there be a significant change in numbers.
