Adjudicators

Justine Anderson

Justine Anderson completed her Masters degree in voice at the Victorian College of the Arts, Melbourne University in 2008 and a fellowship at the Australian National Academy of Music in 2015. She has had wide performance experience as a solo artist and a particular interest in contemporary classical music. Justine is passionate about music education, with many years experience as a music educator and examiner.

Her contemporary classical performances include working with such groups as; the New York based *Bang on a Can*, *Arcko Symphonic Ensemble*, *Three Shades Black*, *Six Degrees Ensemble*, *Icon Trio*, *Hutes*, *Astra*, *Melbourne University's New Music Studio*, *JOLT*, *Forrest Collective*, *Homophonic* and as a guest artist at *A.N.A.M.* In addition

Justine recently performed with *Orchestra Victoria* in Steve Reich's *Music for 18 Musicians* as part of the *Now or Never Festival* and as the solo soprano for their *Games Music Program*.

Justine's opera roles with the opera company *Emotionworks Cut Opera* include Michaela in *Carmen*, *The Witch* in *Hansel and Gretel*, *Tosca* in *Tosca* and *Violetta* in *La Traviata*. In 2013 she performed as part of a collaboration between *Emotionworks* and Opera Australia's Melbourne Ring Festival.

Recordings include an Australian premiere performance for the ABC of the Alberto Ginastera work *Cantata for Magic America*, again performing this important work in 2011 in a concert at the *Australian National University* to celebrate the Bicentenary of Argentina. In 2016 Justine recorded Jonathan Mills *Ethereal Eye* and then performed this work as part of the *Melbourne International Festival*. Other festival performances include *Canberra Festival*, *Bendigo International Festival* and *Port Fairy Spring Festival*.

Additional highlights include a performance as a nightclub singer in the short film 'The Black Pine Road', a role in the play *Orphanage of Animals* (Awarded the Medal of Ulm, Germany 2012) and Matthew Hindson's opera *Love Death Music Plants*. Justine has also worked with *Inventi Chamber Ensemble*, *The Team of Pianists* and as a soloist in various Oratorio performances.

An increasing interest in the collaboration process has seen Justine work with a variety of Australian composers including Annie Hui-Hsin, Eve Duncan, Helen Gifford, Chris Dench, James Hullick, Michael Kieren Harvey and Evan Lawson.

PhD Candidate (Education)

Originally from Graz, Austria, Gerald has been living in Australia for 20 years. He is a permanent, full-time staff member at Monash University (Sir Zelman Cowen School of Music and Performance), where he is coordinating 1st year Popular Music. He is the ensemble director for the Monash University Choir, the Voice Tech Ensemble, Acting for Singers, and the Musical Theatre Chorus. Gerald's efforts have been recognised by receiving the Arts Faculty Citation for Outstanding Contribution to Student Learning (2019), a Commendation for Outstanding Contribution to Teaching and Learning (2020), and a Monash Student Association Award Citation for the Above and Beyond Award (2021). Being an eclectic student, he is currently enrolled in a PhD (Education, Monash), where he has embarked on a cross-disciplinary study bringing sport science, voice mechanics, psychometrics, engineering, and tertiary learning and teaching together.



On-stage experience ranges from lead roles in professional European Music Theatre (400 shows/year) such as CATS, Saturday Night Fever, Buddy Holly and Hair, to lead vocals in bands in Austria, Germany, Denmark and Australia. He plays piano, guitar, drums and bass, is a published songwriter with Universal, a certified Rei-Ki practitioner, has multiple licensed songs in 3 award winning American short films and is a member of AVA, ANATS, APRA (writer) and AMCOS (publisher).

Being an Estill Mentor and Course Instructor with Testing Privileges and Service Distinction, Gerald enjoys teaching Estill courses in Europe and Australia to singers, teachers (i.e. at the Royal Conservatoire of Scotland, Jazz University Graz, Raimund Theatre Vienna) and speech pathologists (i.e. Division of speech pathology at UQ, University clinic Graz). He presented and performed at the Australian Jazz and Improvisation Research Network (AJIRN) symposium in Melbourne (2018), the 2nd International Jazz Voice Symposium in Helsinki (2017), the symposium for Performing Arts and Healthcare in Sydney (2014), was voice consultant to the Musical "Strictly Ballroom" at Her Majesty's Theatre (Melbourne) and is assisting singers through the recovery process from vocal injury in association with Australia's leading laryngologists.

As the driving force behind her boutique production house, Amazon Woman Enterprises, Queenie has been creating multiple award-winning projects for over 20 years. Highlights include: creating four albums, co-writing & co-producing the award-winning *BLUE: The Song of Joni Mitchell* and nurturing her cult following with regular online offerings and performances as her alter-ego Jan van de Stool.

Alongside her performance work Queenie has been a leading arts educator in Australia since 2000. In 2015, Queenie took her passion for the arts to the next level by founding The Australian Musical Theatre Academy (AMTA). Working only with leading creatives in the Australian arts scene, AMTA offers industry level training for students of all skill levels, empowering them to unleash their creative potential and live life to the fullest.

As a true champion of the arts, having joined Actors Equity, MEAA in her very first professional show in 1989, Queenie's unwavering passion for her craft and commitment to the union has made her a powerful advocate for artists Australia wide.

With a staggering 21 theatre award nominations and 8 well-deserved wins under her belt, Queenie van de Zandt's talent continues to be recognized with each new achievement. 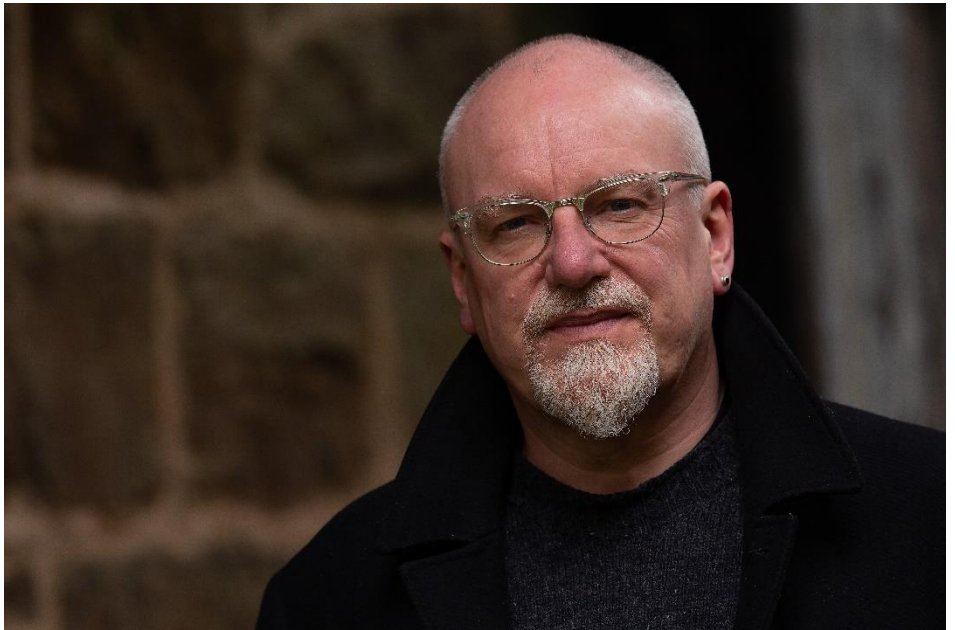
Richard Chew – Guest Adjudicator and Masterclass Presenter

Professor Richard Chew is Director of the Arts Academy, Federation University Australia.

Richard studied at the International Opera School, Royal College of Music, London and was awarded the President's Rose Bowl, presented by H.M. The Queen Mother. He worked as a

principal baritone with many of the UK's major companies including the Royal Shakespeare Company, English National Opera, Glyndebourne, Opera North, Opera Factory and Music Theatre London. Career highlights as a singer include a lieder recital at the National Portrait Gallery for BBC Radio 3, Juan, in the world premiere of Mark Anthony Turnage's opera *Country of the Blind* (ENO, 50th Aldeburgh Festival, BBC Radio 3), Dad, in Turnage's *Greek* (Queen Elizabeth Hall, London and Cite de la Musique, Paris), Sam, in Leonard Bernstein's *Trouble in Tahiti* (Barbican Theatre London, City of London Sinfonia with conductor Marin Alsop) and Papageno (*The Magic Flute*), QEH, London and Symphony Hall, Birmingham.

Richard is an acclaimed composer and commissions include works for the Adelaide Festival, Adelaide Cabaret Festival, Vienna Festival, English National Opera, Welsh National Opera, Young Vic Theatre Company (Barbican and New Victory Theatre, Broadway), Festival of Arts and Ideas, New Haven USA, and Salisbury Cathedral (750th Anniversary commission). Richard is an Associate Artist with the Australian Music Centre and his music is published by Wirripang.
