Rebecca Norris - All Abilities

This is Rebecca's 1st year as Discipline Chair. She has one child with a disability and loves this opportunity that RSSS provides as a chance to get up and perform in a non-competitive concert arena. It's always a lovely display of talent and she always has to work hard not to cry!

All Abilities is sponsored by UFS and Asztec and will be held at the Ballarat Special School Farm Campus.

Andrea Brown - Calisthenics

This is Andrea's 5th year of discipline chair, having begun right at the onset of Covid! This year, Calisthenics will be at Founders Hall which is a disappointment after announcing our return to Her Majesty's Theatre. She is still hopeful that the solos finals will be back at Her Maj, which is important as this is the 100 year celebration of Graceful Solo.

There are approximately 40 comps this year to be held over 22 days.

Andrea encouraged people to help, especially backstage. It's not a tricky job, and there's is always someone available to help if you get stuck.

Karen Pengelly – Instrumental Bands and Solo

We welcome Freemasons back as the naming rights sponsor for this section. There are new non-competitive sections and masterclasses this year, as a result of feedback from a range of local schools who are looking for performance opportunities and educational benefit, not necessarily in a competitive format.

Bands and Solos will be held at Founders Hall again this year.

Carolyn Bennett / Lauren Knight - Pianoforte

Lauren recently stepped down from Discipline Chair so she could feel more comfortable entering her students and will be an advisor to Carolyn who has now taken over the role. Piano will be held at the Masonic Lodge this year and has also introduced some noncompetitive sections.

Carolyn Bennett / Lauren Knight - Celebrating Chopin

As per above, Carolyn has temporarily stepped into the role of discipline chair, with Lauren Knight as advisor. This will be held at the Art Gallery and is generously sponsored and supported by Dr Andrew Cochrane in memory of his mother Margaret Schofield. Brooke Johnson - Choral

This is Brooks 2nd year as Discipline Chair. Last year it was at Civic Hall, and this year at Founders Theatre which is much more suitable for large groups. We offer Primary,

secondary, and Community choral sections. We have also introduced some non-competitive sections in this discipline, along with sections for rural and country schools.

Loretta Kaval – Debating

Kris Carroll - Speech and Drama

ACU have also accepted naming rights sponsor for Speech and Drama. This is Kris Carrolls first year as discipline chair. It will be held at Connors Hall. Kris and her family have a long-standing history with Royal South street Society, having been involved in many disciplines, with Speech and Drama really feeling like a space she truly felt connected to. With so many fun and interesting sections, this is a great one to volunteer for!

Carolyn Bennett - Vocal

Freemasons have recently signed up as naming rights sponsor for Vocal. Carolyn has been vocal discipline chair for just over 15 years after taking over from Lloyd Harvey in 2008. It will be held at the Mechanics Institute (Minerva Space). Along with Freemasons, we have picked up a new sponsor in Victorian Opera who are offering a chance for our classical singers to be selected to perform in the Ballarat Opera Festival. Volunteer Management Plan

Volunteer Management Plan – Carolyn Bennett

Part of Carolyn's role in the office is 'Volunteer Coordinator' and as such has put together a Volunteer Management Plan at the request of Judy-Ann and the board.

The plan is quite comprehensive, but today Carolyn wanted to cover the three objectives that have been set out in the plan.

1. Engage and Recruit New Volunteers

Over the past month, we have reached out to over 30 community groups (including sporting clubs, libraries, retirement homes, senior citizens groups, not for profit organisations) telling them about our organisation and encouraging new members to sign up.

2. Retain Active Members

Acknowledge the value and experience of our existing volunteers. This feeds into the next objective which Carolyn wanted to outline in detail today.

3. Provide Meaningful Engagement

Finding ways to enhance the volunteer experience through benefits, incentives and rewards.

- i. Birthday vouchers sponsored by Homeground Café
- ii. Volunteer of the Month (August / September / October) a tally of hours worked during our peak period – sponsored by Michael Unwin Wines
- iii. Special Awards go above and beyond to receive a special gift. For example 'refer a friend' (thanks to Kris Carroll who has already signed up 4 new volunteers!) or special mention during the competitions as noted by our audience, competitors or our discipline chairs – sponsored by Hecho en Mexico and Regent Multiplex Cinemas
- iv. Most Hours Volunteered at the end of the year, a special award for the volunteer who has donated the most hours (staff and board are not included in this award) - sponsored by Regent Multiplex Cinemas and Michael Unwin Wines
- v. Credit Pass sign up for 4 volunteer shifts and receive a gold pass to attend any session during the 2024 season (excludes ticketed finals). All volunteers who sign up for a shift will also receive a small gift.

vi. Mentor/Mentee programs – Carolyn asked for experienced volunteers to sign up to our mentoring program to help guide new members, or members who wish to train in another area. Sign up by emailing <u>volunteer@royalsouthstreet.com.au</u>. Members wishing to learn from a mentor would also email upon signing up for a shift.



- 4. Volunteer Service we acknowledge the years of service our volunteers have given us. Awards for 5, 10, 15, 20, 25, 30, 35 and 40 years of service. Particular mention to Dr. Tony Cole, Ron and Dawn Harrington and Peter Zala for 40 years of service in 2024.

Karen is the Community Sales Manager for the past 3 years, and works in developing the lifestyle community. Currently they have 69 homes settled and 105 residents. She acknowledges the journey is not for everyone, but the fantastic facilities and amazing people at Parkside Lucas are something to be proud of. Ingenia is a publicly listed company, with 3 properties in Victoria (Lara, Beveridge and Ballarat, with plans for opening in Sunbury in the future). It's a booming industry, with numbers growing all the time. She invited everyone to the open day on Saturday 20th April between 11 and 2.

Karen noted that the feeling she got at the AGM last night, resonated strongly with the community like-minded people within Ingenia. They are all looking out for one another, they are passionate, love what they do, and are eager to help.

If you, or someone you know, is interested in finding out more about Ingenia, she is always happy to chat to you.

Ingenia's connection with RSSS began last year and they were happy with the outcome, and can see a definite benefit to both parties with a continued association.

MyStage Training Session – Welcome to Albert (or Wilson) MyStage

We then heard from Albert and Wilson, the co-creators of MyStage who gave us an overview of the basics of MyStage (this is one of the computer platforms we use during the competitions)

We learnt how to;

Register a new competitor on arrival

- Check their entry details
- Amend of fill in their performance details (ie song name)
- Mark whether they are using a backing track

Change the Status of a competitor (eg registered, stage-ready, awaiting results)

Enter and View Results and Aggregates

Change competitor order

Withdraw a competitor from a section

We then had some time to play with a 'test mode' version of MyStage to we could get a feel for how it worked.

When volunteering for a role (ie Registration) you will always be paired with someone who knows the role very well. Once you register a few competitors, the repetitive process helps you to gain confidence in the role very quickly.

During the competitions, a detailed 'how-to' guide will be at every volunteer station.
